PARTY (Playful, Active, Recreation Targeted for YOU)-on is a three-part program to get teens excited about the outdoors using Global Positioning System technology. PARTY-

on will work with partners established in the PARTY program (funded by REAP CEP in 2005), as well as work with two new partners. Students will learn to use a GPS, then students will go to a local park to do a service learning project, and will map the work they do using GPS. During a third program, students will learn and participate in an outdoor skill, using the GPS while recreating. Environmental issues will be incorporated into the programs.
